Transdanube transnational seminar in Tulcea, Romania

During the period 14-15 May 2014, the fifth transnational seminar will be organised within TRANSDANUBE - "Sustainable Transport and Tourism along the Danube" project funded under the South East Europe Transnational Cooperation Programme, Priority Axis "Improvement of the accessibility", Key Area of Intervention "Improve coordination in promoting, planning and operation for primary and secondary transportation networks".

The transnational seminar will be followed by a study visit organised in the Danube Delta where representatives of the National Institute for Research and Development in Tourism, as well as representatives of project partners will be present: Environment Agency Austria - Lead Partner; Regional government of Burgenland (Austria); Governing Region Department of Strategy and Project Management Bratislava (Slovakia); West Pannon Regional and Economic Development Nonprofit Ltd (Hungary); Bakony and Balaton Regional Tourism Nonprofit Ltd (Hungary); Regional Administration of Vidin Region (Bulgaria); Club Sustainable Development of Civil Society (Bulgaria); The South-East Regional Development Agency (Romania), Slovak Cycle Club (Slovakia); Danube Office Ltd (Germany); Danube Competence Center (Serbia); Regional Agency for Development of the Eastern Serbia (Serbia); Association of Tourism Development in Moldova (Moldova).

TRANSDANUBE is a transnational project with 14 partners from 8 countries and over 25 strategic associated partners and observers.

The South East Development Region is represented in the TRANSDANUBE project by the South-East Regional Development Agency as a partner and the Danube Delta Biosphere Reserve Administration with the role of strategic associated partner.

In accordance with the objectives of the South East Europe Programme (SEE), the TRANSDANUBE project, after two years of implementation, aims to develop sustainable mobility along the Danube through the promotion of multimodal transport, in order to raise awareness among the key stakeholders regarding the concept of sustainable tourism in the entire Danube region.
